

FSRH ASM 2023 - FAQs

Is the conference virtual or in-person?

The FSRH ASM 2023 is taking place at the [Golden Jubilee Conference Hotel](#) in Glasgow, and on a virtual platform. While virtual delegates won't be able to attend breakout workshops or meeting colleagues in person, they will still be able to create a virtual name badge to network on our platform, as well as watch a live stream of the main stage, and attend the virtual exhibition. Virtual delegates will be able to watch the live stream and ask questions live.

What is the conference platform?

The ASM will be taking place through a virtual platform called Oxford Abstracts. In order to submit an abstract or register to buy tickets for yourself or someone else, you will need to create an Oxford Abstracts account or log in to an existing one. All in-person and virtual delegates will be able to use the platform on the day to access the programme, live stream and network. Will I be able to watch presentations back after 23 June?

Both virtual and in-person delegates will have access to recordings of the main stage presentations for up to one month after they are made available on the platform. Please note that the recordings will not be immediately available and may take up to 2 weeks to be accessible on the platform.

Where can I stay?

You are welcome to stay at the conference venue, the [Golden Jubilee Conference Hotel](#) in Clydebank, Glasgow. Once you've bought your conference ticket, ring the hotel on 0141 951 6000 and tell them you're attending the FSRH Annual Scientific Meeting on 23 June 2023, and while they have availability, they will book you a room at a reduced delegate rate of £88.00.

Are there any social activities connected to the conference?

After a day of exchanging on the latest SRH research, delegates are invited to attend the conference dinner at the Golden Jubilee Conference Hotel in the evening of Friday 23 June. When you purchase your conference ticket, you will be given the option to buy a ticket to the conference dinner as an add-on. There will also be many networking opportunities throughout the day.

How do I get to the Golden Jubilee Conference Hotel?

On the banks of the River Clyde, the Golden Jubilee Conference Hotel is just 20 minutes from Glasgow Airport, a 10-minute walk from Dalmuir station with quick links to Glasgow Central, and just 20 minutes from the Loch Lomond and The Trossachs National Park.

By rail

Take a low-level train from either Glasgow Queen Street or Central Station to Dalmuir Station. There are approximately 11 trains per hour.

Direct trains also run between Dalmuir and Edinburgh Waverley and if you are travelling from London, the Caledonian Sleeper runs nightly.

Dalmuir station is a 10-minute walk from the hotel.

By bus

From Glasgow city centre you can take the First Glasgow bus service numbers 1, 1A, 1B, 1D. These services all travel along Dumbarton Road and the stop for the Hotel is at the end of Beardmore Street. The hotel is located on Beardmore Street at the roundabout.

From Glasgow International Airport

The hotel is approximately a 20-minute drive from Glasgow International Airport. Use the M8/M898 and follow signs for Erskine Bridge. Once over the Erskine Bridge, follow the route on the map below.

A Glasgow Airport taxi from the Airport will cost approx. £25.

By car

The hotel is easily accessed from the M8, junction 30, west of Glasgow. For all sat nav devices our postcode is G81 4SA. Parking is free to all hotel guests.

Is the ASM accessible?

We endeavour to make our conferences and events as accessible as possible, which is one reason why we have opted for a hybrid conference in 2023. When you purchase your conference ticket, you will be asked if you have any accessibility and dietary requirements.

The venue has ten designated accessible parking spaces at the front of the building and luggage assistance is available. The main entrance has an automatic powered door and the front entrance is a level access. Accessible bedrooms are available.

All doors, entrances and corridors at the venue are wide enough for wheelchairs and walking frames, and there is a talking lift. The main meeting rooms of the venue have a hearing loop system and portable seating arrangements.

There are two accessible all-gender toilets in the public areas of the building.

Who can submit an abstract?

Doctors, academics, SAS doctors, trainees, nurses, midwives, and other healthcare professionals and students can submit abstracts to the competition. Make sure to complete your submission by **23:59 BST on Sunday, 23 April 2023**.

What if my abstract is selected?

Up to eight of the highest scoring abstracts will be invited to deliver an oral presentation in person at the ASM in Glasgow on 23 June 2023, a number of other successful applicants will be invited to submit a poster in-person in Glasgow.

If your abstract is accepted, at least one author must book to attend the conference (at your own cost) – if you are accepted for an oral or in-person poster presentation, you must buy a ticket [here](#) to attend the conference in-person in Glasgow. Failure to book a place may result in your abstract and presentation being withdrawn from the conference.
